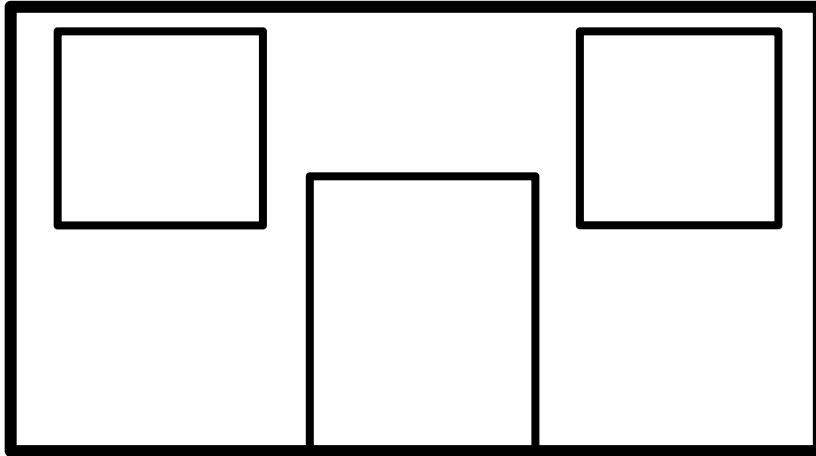

Instructions to This Module:

- Only complete the assessment under direction of your supervisor who should be an ABISC.

- You are encouraged to get in contact with the ABI Program Administrator to discuss the assessment in more detail. You can contact the ABI Program Administrator by calling (801) 538-8244.

- You may practice this assessment multiple times under supervisor direction to get a feel on how to administer it. The practice will be as follows:

1. Observe the administration (done by an ABISC) of the assessment to an actual client.
2. Administer the assessment on one of your colleagues twice. (Use your judgment on how comfortable you feel).
3. Administer the assessment to an actual client under ABISC supervision.

Objectives of This Module:

- a) Understand the important parts of the assessment.
- b) Understand how to direct questions to a person with ABI.
- c) Understand how to score each question.
- d) Understand how to use the manual as a guiding tool for the assessment.
- e) Understand that the score needs to be within 40-120.
